Running up the slope for 95 years

LOAKES Park has carved its own special place in the hearts of Wycombe Wanderers' loyal supporters.

It was with heavy hearts, therefore, that they paid homage to a sloping ground which possesses a rich 95-year history.

Here is the history of Loakes Park in summary

In 1894 the club decided to rent Spring Meadows to get away from the difficult conditions on the Rye.

Lord Carrington was approached to see if Loakes Park could be rented.

The first match to be played at Loakes Park was a friendly against Park Grove on September 7,


On May 21, 1896, it was announced that Wycombe's application to join the Southern League had been accepted.

The AGM of 1896 heard that receipts in the first season at Loakes Park had been just under £408, compared with £114 at Spring Meadow.

Following a disturbance during a Southern League fixture against Portsmouth RA. Loakes Park was closed for one week by FA rul-

At the end of the 1898/99 season it was decided to level the pitch.

In October 1903, Harry Browning of the Red Lion Hotel, initiated a scheme to build a stand on the upper side of Loakes Park. The new stand was ready by January 9, 1904, when Southampton Reserves were the visitors in the Southern League.

During a Berks & Bucks Senior Cup first round match against Chesham Generals at Loakes Park, Chesham right back, A Bone, broke his leg, which was later amputated. The accident happened in November, 1905, and a benefit match was later played.

Wycombe's application to join the Spartan League was accepted just before the outbreak of the First World War.

Work started on extensions to either side of the stand in December 1922, the money being raised by loan. The stand was opened for the visit of St Albans in an Amateur Cup second round match on January 20, 1923

New dressing rooms were opened at Loakes park at the start of the 23-24 season.

Wycombe won the Ama-

The bottom stand was opened by RA Lunnon, President of the Berks & Bucks FA, on February 13,

Before the start of the World War, Second Loakes Park was used for gas chamber demonstrations to the general public.

Frank Adams presented Loakes Park to the club as a gift during the 1946-47 season.

Loakes Park's record attendance is 15,850, recorded against St Albans in the fourth round of the FA Amateur Cup, on February 28, 1950.

The Football Trust 1990 has been created to help the game at all levels and to assist clubs meet the requirements of Lord Justice Taylor's Final Report.

Developing the game outside the professional structure is an important objective and substantial funds have been made available for essential safety work and pitch and changing room improvements at Pyramid clubs. The GM Vauxhall Conference is one of the beneficiaries of Trust support and over £500,000 has already been spent on work at grounds in the competition.

Fan recalls 65 years

By Reg Holt, of Maybrook Gardens, High Wycombe

I HAVE been a member of the Wanderers for 65 years. My father made me a junior member when I left school at 13. It cost five shillings for juniors and £1 for adults.

The line up for the first full team I can remember was as follows: In goal, Alf Keating, backs Nelson Rolfe and Frank Dideot. Half backs Fred Gates, Archie Gomm and Salt Smith, and forwards Joey Grace, Tommy Jackeman, Reg Boreham, Klon Smith and Alf Fryer.

In those days the formation was a goal-keeper, two backs, three half backs and five forwards

Archie Gomm was the first player to sign professional. He went to Millwall for the then maximum fee of £8 per week.

Frank Adams took over his position at centre-half. We were then playing in the Spartan League which we won on a number of occasions.

The stand in those days was only the centre part that we now know. The dressing room was a thatched roof building attached to the rear end of the stand.

Later the stand was extended to the full length of the pitch with dressing rooms built at the rear.

The groundsman was Charlie Tilbury. His roller and mower were pulled by horse-power.


There were no loudspeakers and the music before the game and during half-time was by the Furniture Trades Band or the Marsh Silver Band.

In those days most of the travelling was done by train but on some occasions, horse transport had to be used.

Our colours were always Oxford and Cambridge quarters and we were always known as the 'Chair Bodgers'.

My glorious years

A FEW of memories was played for about two since I joined Wanderers in 1935.....

A.Britnell, R.Cox, A.Greenwell, P.Broderick were playing from the Amateur Cup winning side of 1931.

I had a mixed bag of first and reserve games for two years then established a regular first team place.

The side that played the last games of 1939 was, I think, the best of the few years, winning every game until the war stopped the football: N.Hollman, J.Gearing, J.Meeks, L.Chapman, B.Crump, P.Ridgeley, G.Walker, F.Gearing, W.McCallum, D.Busby J.Andrews, A.Britnell.

Four of this team were war. in the R.Boreham was secretary and B.Spatchet, chairman with a selection committee of old players. No football

years then the Great West-Combination was formed.

I was discharged from the Navy with perforated ear drums in 1935 and was exempt from service and found myself the only pre-war player other than A.Britnell in the side we could get together. The rest of the first team and reserves were in the forces and could only play when on leave or stationed near-

Alf Britnell, the goal scorer in the 1-0 win in the final retired and I took over

the captain's job.
We used my works team of B.J.L. in the Sunday League as reserves and won the league twice. We were better prepared than most when the Isthmian

League got going again. I was very lucky or hard and did not get injured By J. McCallum

much but caught one the Saturday before our patron and ex-captain Frank Adams handed over the deeds of Loakes Park to the club

I am in the souvenir programme photo at the end of the line with my overcoat on and my left arm a passenger.

Bert Crump was captain for the day. I carried on as captain until '49-'50 season then F. Gearing took

The season '50-'51 was good for the club. We had several gates with large attendances and one with St. Albans of nearly 17,000 (a record).

This game was the quarter-final of the Amateur Cup. The team was: Lodge, Flippance, Cruper, Jack-son, Gearing, Way, Gearing, Way, McCallum(2 Blizard,

goals), Mackrut(1), But- ed. It was with mixed feel-ler(1), Birdseye, reserve ings that we lined up for Westley.

1952. I felt I should retire at 38 but was still playing well. fairly Then J.McCormick was made manager. He naturally wanted a young side and introduced the Tottenham style of push and run.

I would have welcomed a reserve team job but it was plain the old players were out. Jackson, Gearing, McCallum were snapped up by Aylesbury Unit-


ings that we lined up for an F.A. Cup tie on Loakes Park.

After being told we were too old, we won 2-1 and I scored the winner. This match was played four weeks after we finished at Wycombe.

I finished playing for Aylesbury at 42 with my son John in the same forward line. Then four years as Aylesbury team manager and I called it a good

Magical day when we won the cup

DESPITE hazy memories of the two great players, Frank Adams and Reg Boreham, my first vivid recollections are of the Amateur Cup Final at Highbury in 1931 when Wycombe Wanderers beat Hayes by one goal to nil.

Never can I forget how Bill Brown's penalty kick was saved and how Alf Britnell latched on to the loose ball and slammed home the winner.

My mother insisted that I, then a boy of 11, was the first person to hold the

cup after the captain. What a thrill it was to have been in the Guildhall on the evening of that wonderful cup final and to look through the window into the crowded High Street to see the old wagonette carrying along the victorious Wanderers and offi-

cials together with the cup. My father, Ted, served on the committee for years, and it was great fun to travel in the coach with the team to away games when dad was "in charge".

Although the Highbury

final was an epic, I will always remember the thrilling games, the wonderful teams and the outstanding players who graced the famous slope at Loakes Park.

There were some wonderful characters on the terraces, too. The inoffensive wit and good natured leg pulling which rang from the crowd seldom, if ever, upset the visiting supporters.

What a pity it is that some of the old expressions are no longer heard. These days we never hear "come Wycombe, dip yer ad in! That's the



In the other semi-final Hayes were to play Bishop Auckland — a repeat of 1931 when Hayes won to play ycombe in the final.

But Bishop Auckland were bidding to complete a hat-trick of Amateur Cup wins and made no mistake this time.





He responded in the only way he knows how. Everytime the ball came to his feet Best seldom made a wrong move.

Playing Forest before a big Wycombe crowd will be the opening Adams Park deserves.








